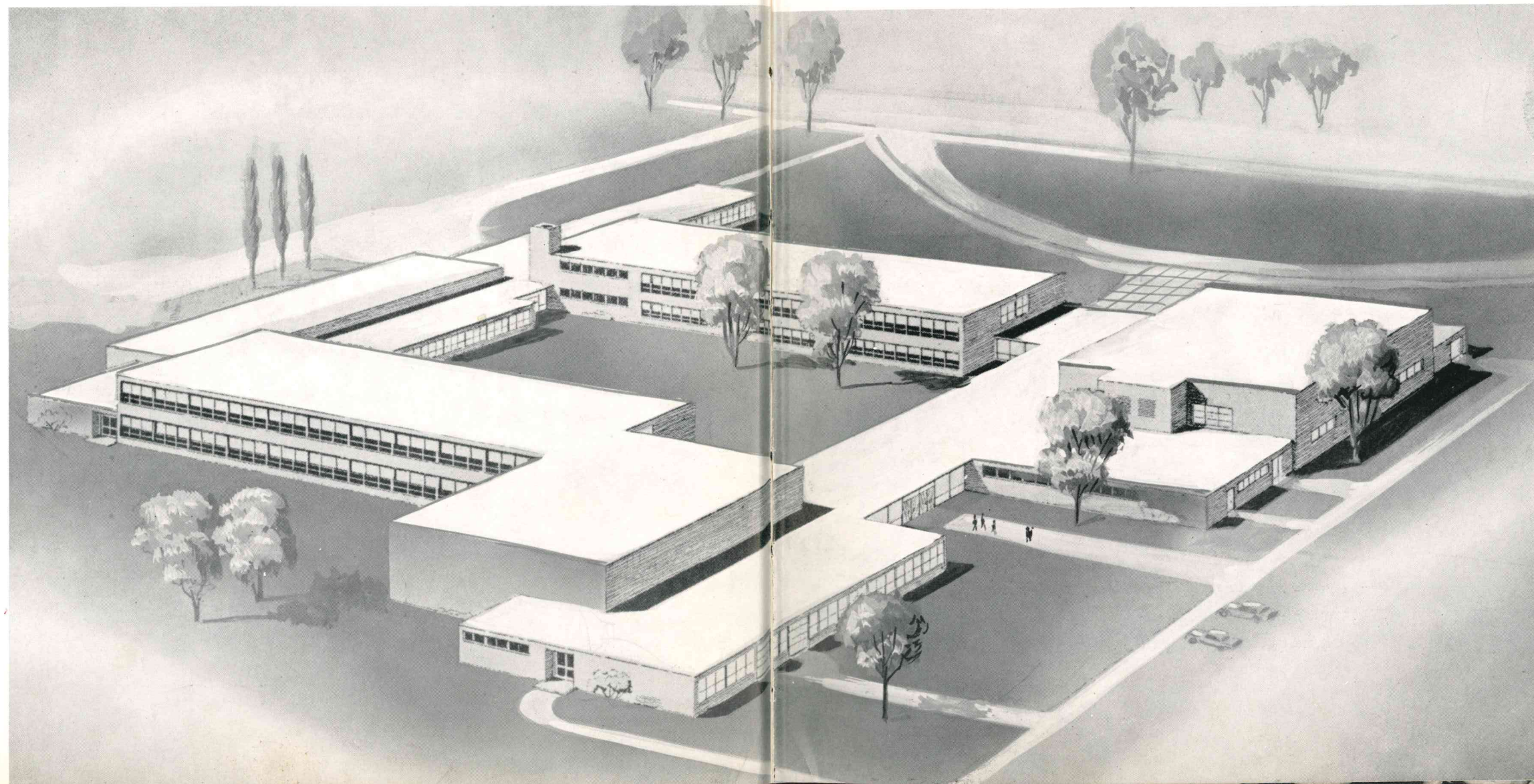

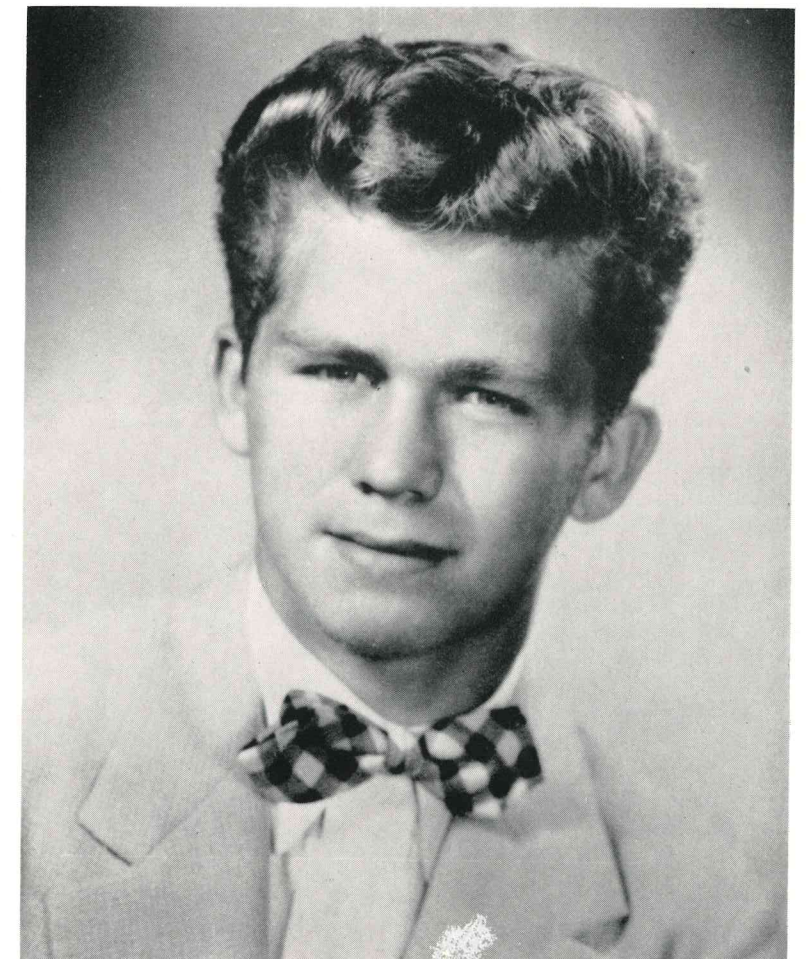
We, the members of the Class of 1956, who are about to leave the beloved corridors of our school to take our places among others in the world, cannot help but think of the students who have preceded us.

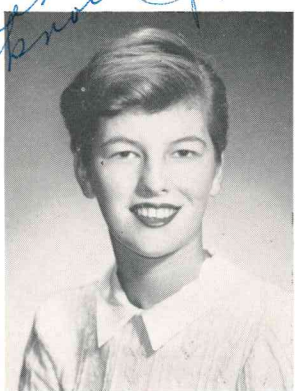
Prom

A History of

We, the class of "1956", all too soon realize that our high school years are coming to a close. The memories of our four years will always remain with us.

Upon entering our Freshman year everything was new and strange to us. But before we knew it, initiation week had arrived. We wore beanies and signs that praised the Sophomores, and we really had fun carrying books from one class to another. As the year progressed we held class meetings. At one class meeting we decided to sponsor a square dance. This experience brought many unexpected problems to the class, but as time passed each one seemed to work itself out. With the help of our advisors the dance turned out to be a social as well as a financial success.

In our Sophomore year the tables were turned and we were given the privilege to initiate the Freshman class. We decided that the Freshman girls should wear two different kinds of socks, one side of their hair set, and no makeup. The boys had to wear ribbons in their hair, one pant leg rolled up to their knee, and skirts over their pants. Both had to carry signs that read "Allah Sophs." We ended initiation week with an assembly, and the Freshman class performed different skits. From that time forward the Freshmen were recognized by the upperclassmen as being high school students. We held a square dance this year, which seemed easier to plan because of the venture we had the year before. Thanks again to the full cooperation of the student body the dance was a huge success. In the spring we held a raffle to raise funds for our trip to Coney Island. Along with our advisors, Mr. Lukoski and Mr. Markey, we had an enjoyable time. This was the year that a few of our classmates gained recognition for their qualities of leadership, service, character, and scholarship by becoming probationary members of the National Honor Society.

In September, 1954, we commenced our Junior year. The usual procedure of electing officers took place in our first class meeting, along with the discussion of a square dance which was held in October and proved to be a success. Finally the big event of the year, the annual Junior Prom was before us. A committee was set up which was to plan the decorations for the gymnasium. Everyone was eager to make our Prom a success. The prom committee, with the consent of the class, decided upon a pink and light blue color combination. All helped in decorating the gymnasium. The crowns were dark blue and silver. 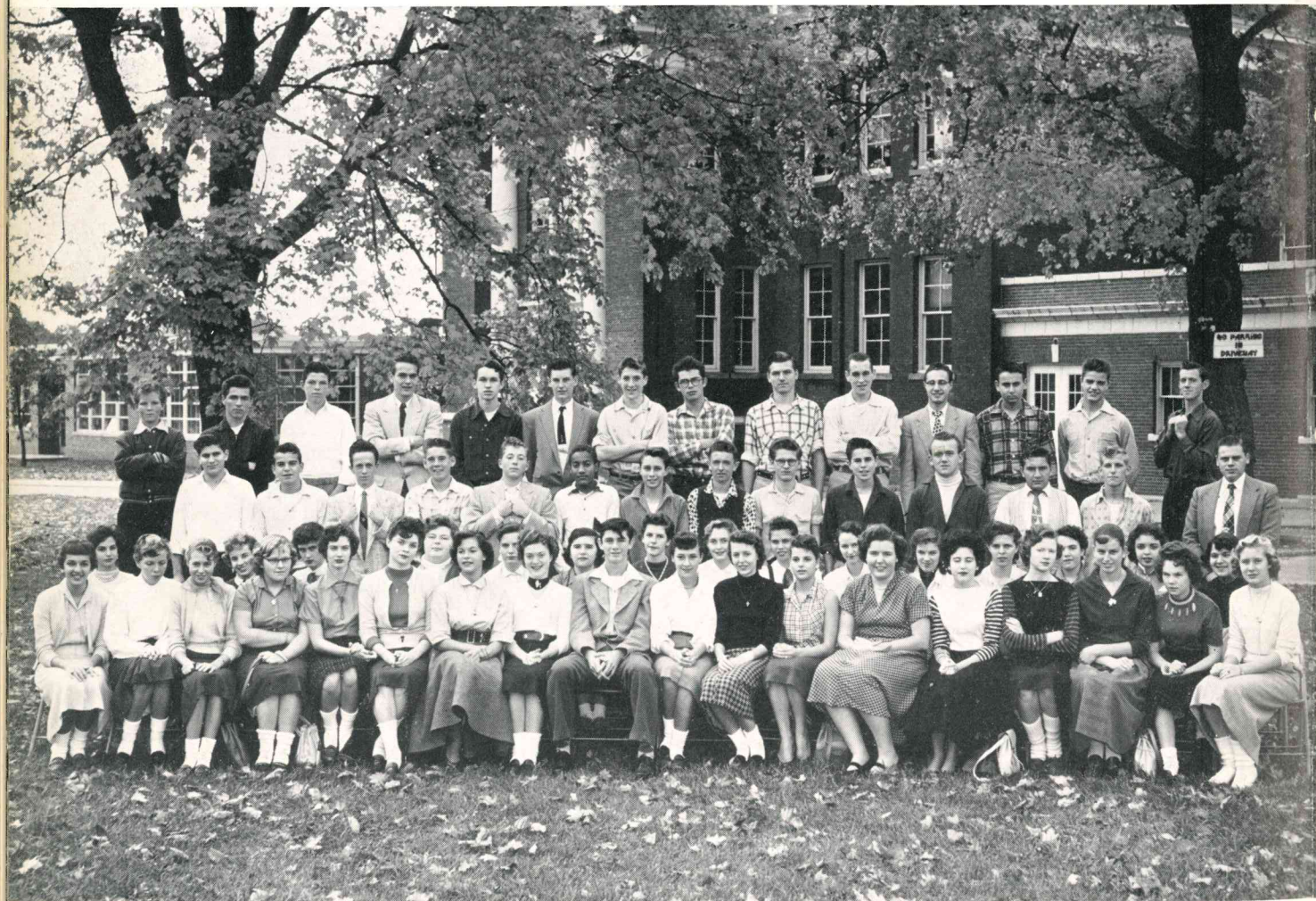

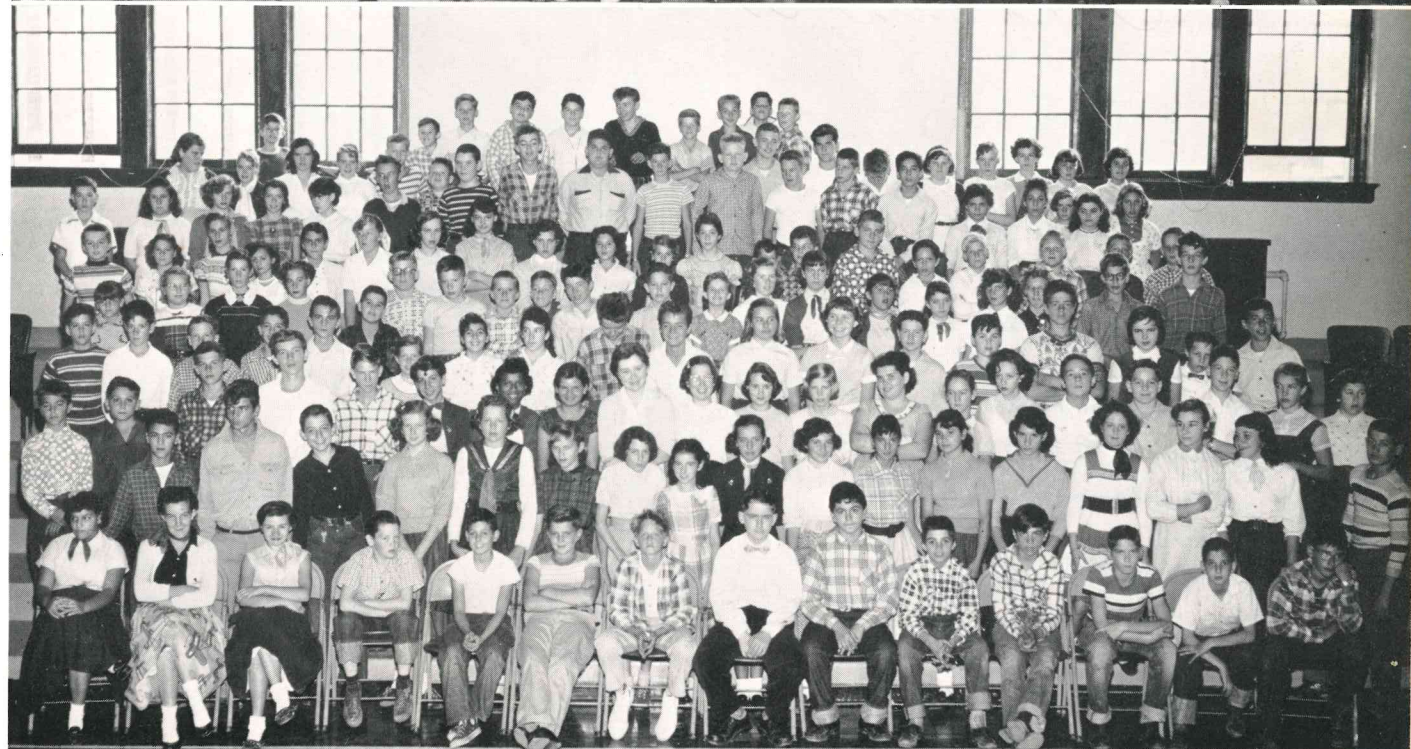
