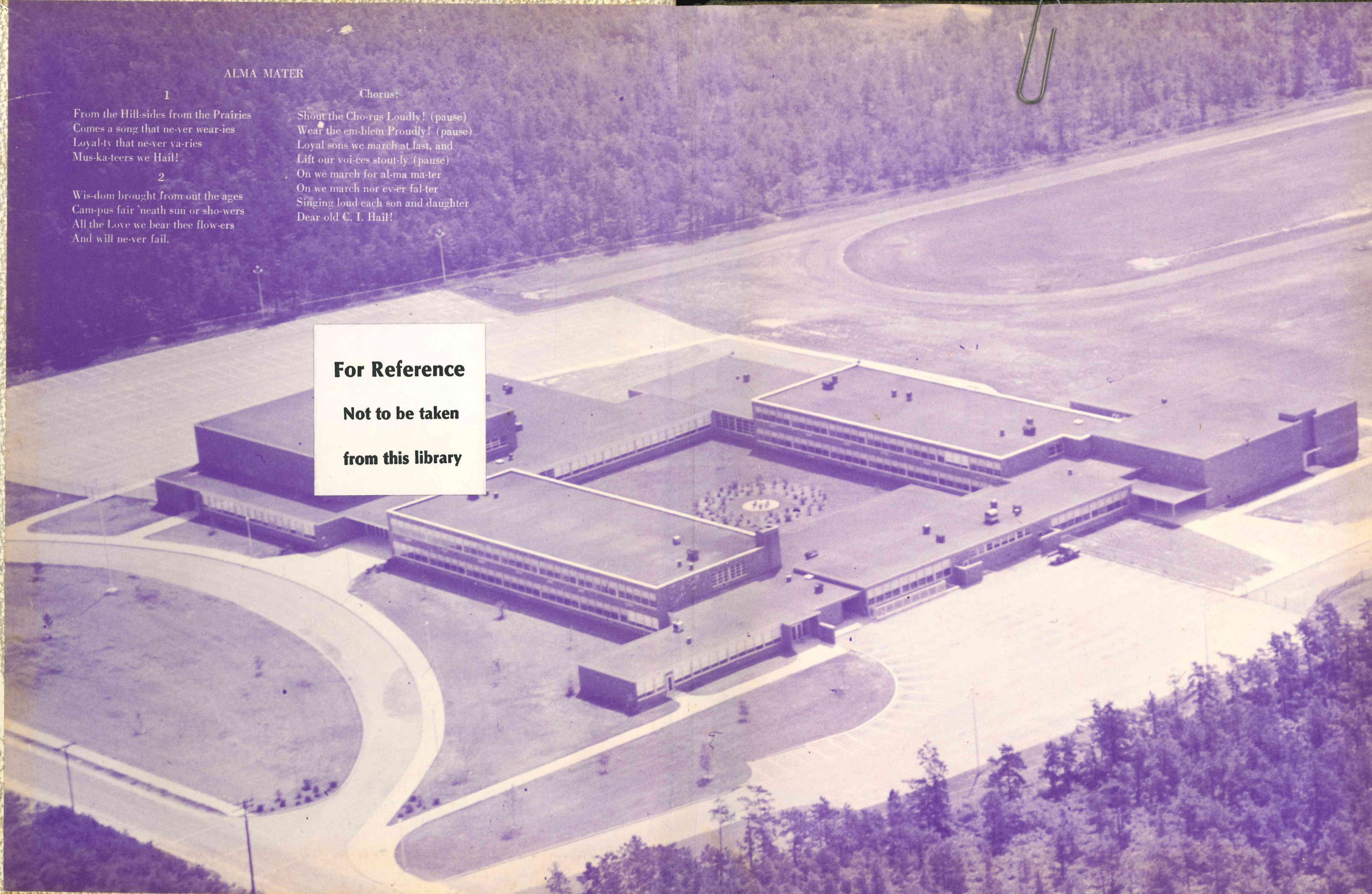

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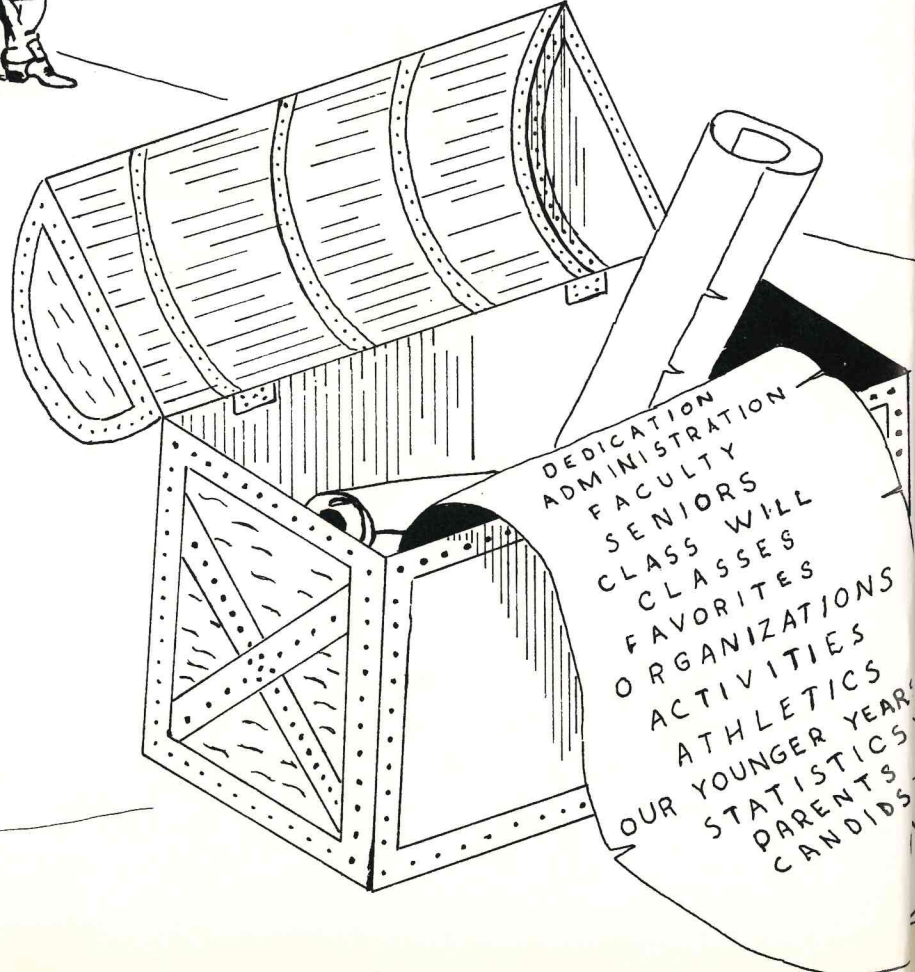
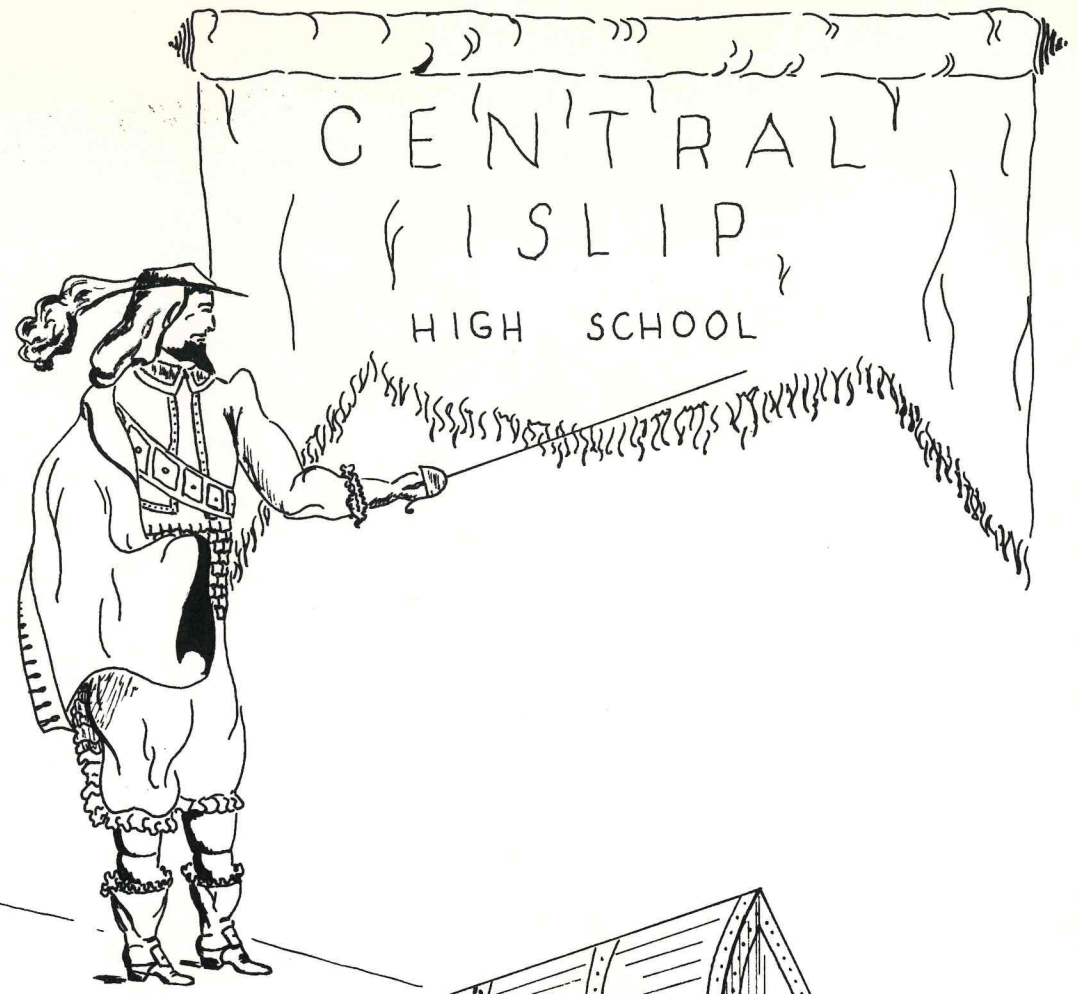

Although he was not here to lead us through our Senior Year, the Senior Class would like to thank him for his past guidance and his never-failing friendship.

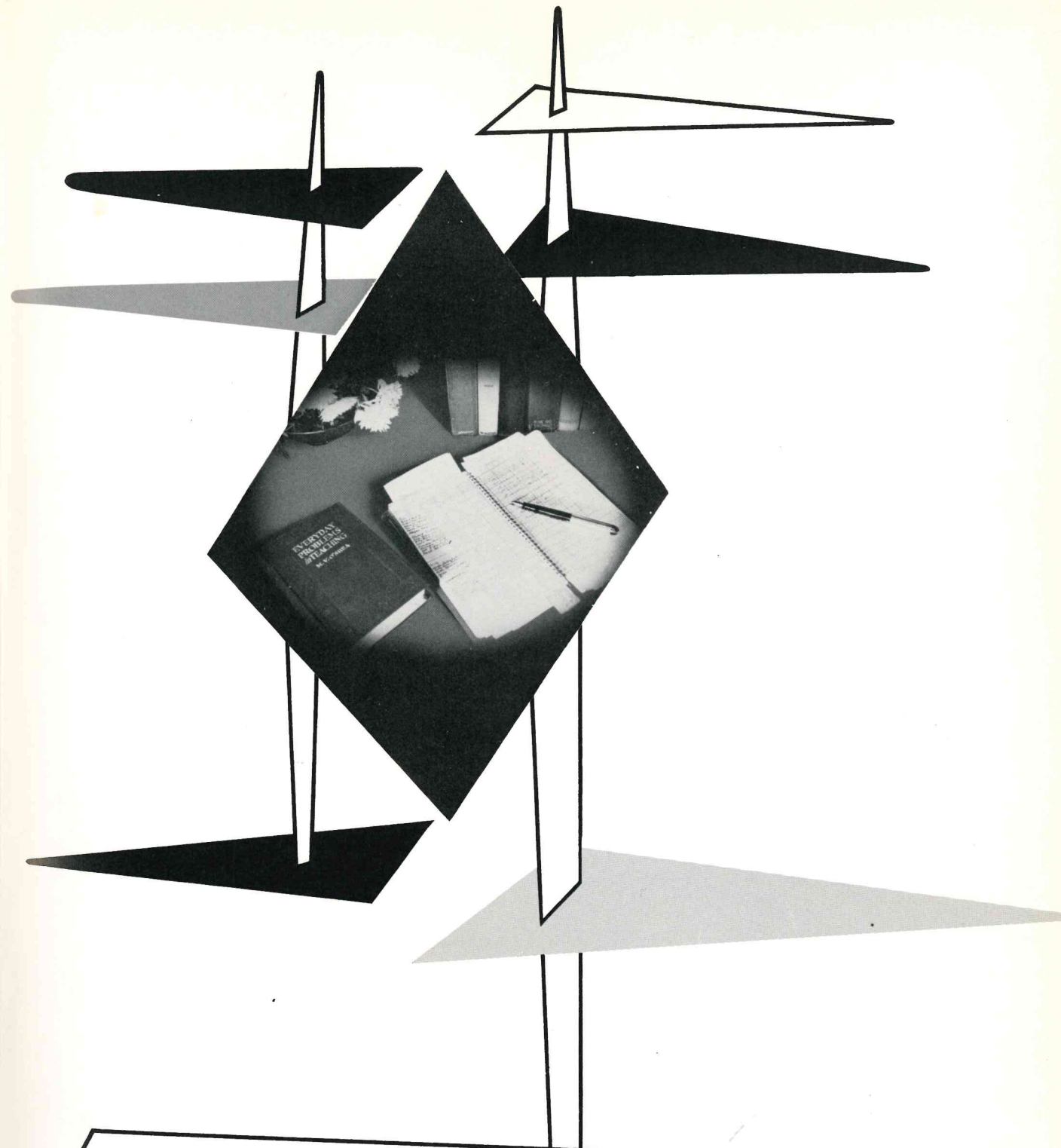

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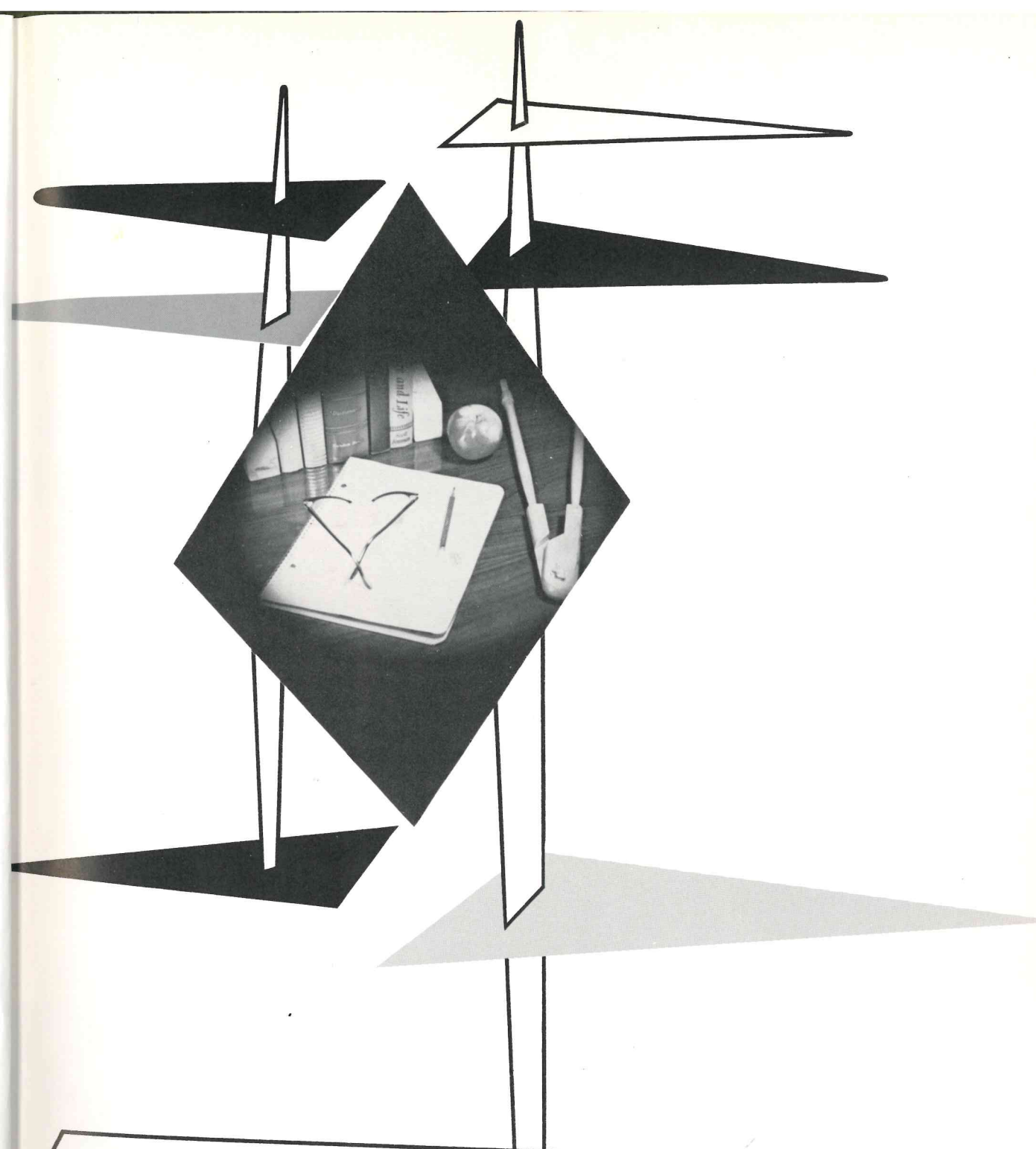
GRADUATES

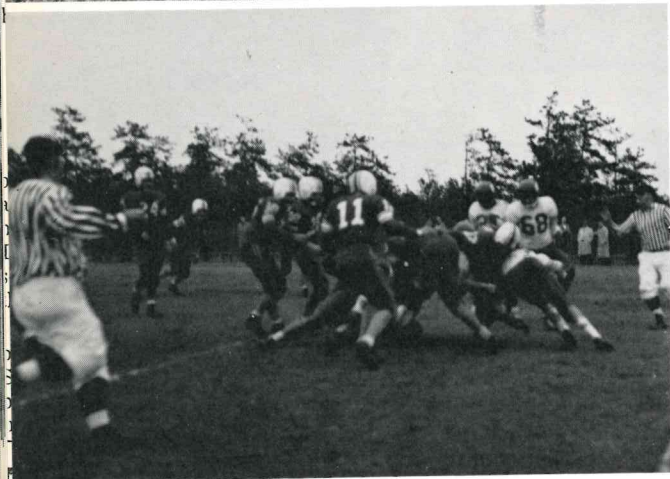

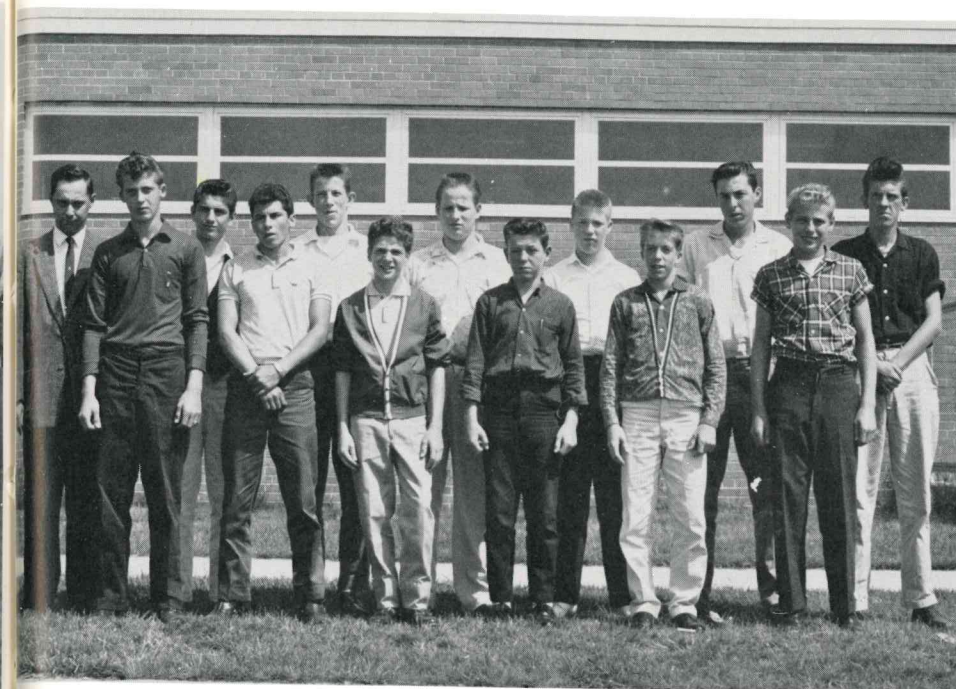
The nucleus of the team was composed mostly of juniors and sophomores, which should indicate a better rounded team in the near future.
