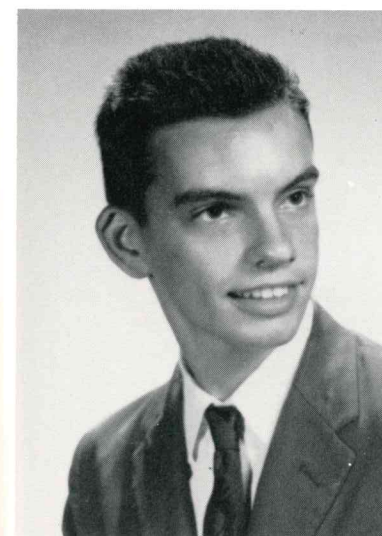


THE CROSS COUNTRY TEAM

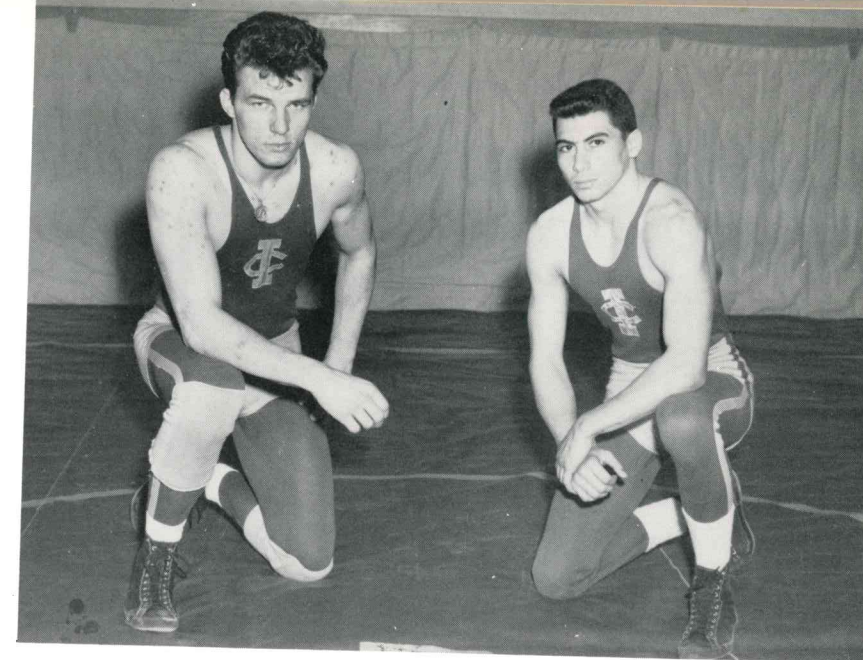

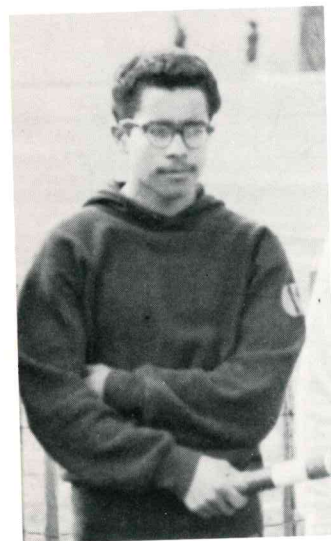

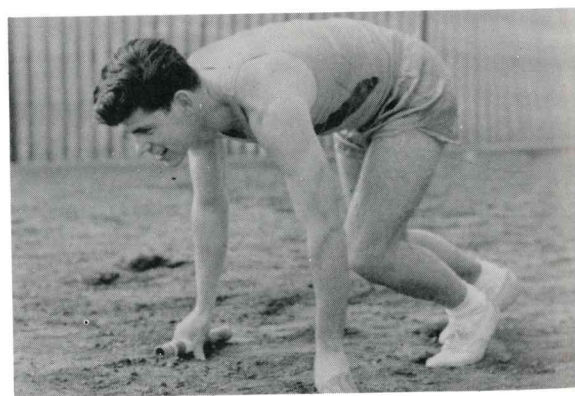
COACH PHILIP WILLIAMS AND THE 1961 TRACK TEAM.

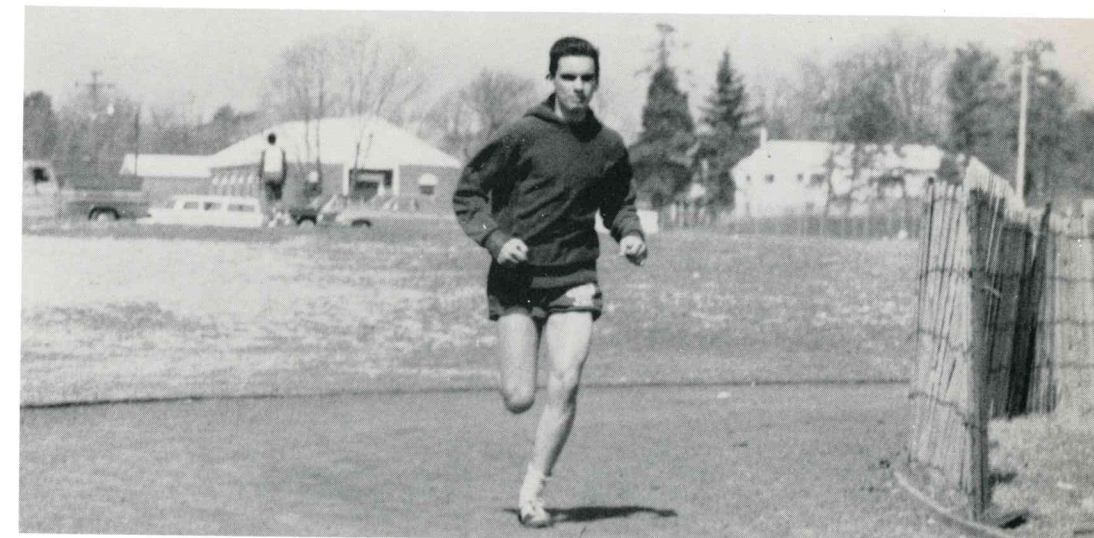
